

Donations needed for the food pantry



Catholic Q&A

Question: Why do we hold hands during the Our Father?

Answer: The practice of members of the assembly holding hands while praying the Lord's Prayer during the Mass is a custom that developed organically in the 1970s and 1980s. While some commentators acknowledge that the practice varies from place to place, it is a fairly universal reality in parishes across the United States. For some, this action symbolizes the communion of Christians praying together as one family of believers honoring the Father of All. Critics of the practice sometimes express concern that holding hands can be a distraction from the more significant unity that is experienced when we process to the altar to receive sacramental communion.

And so, we're left to ask, what is the answer?

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (the document that offers specific instructions for the celebration of the Mass) is silent on the practice, saying only that "all the faithful say the prayer" with the priest. The website of the U.S. Bishops simply observes that "No position is prescribed in the Roman Missal for an assembly gesture during the Lord's Prayer." Thus, we're left to discern within ourselves and within our parishes and religious communities what is an authentic gesture of praise during this important point of the Mass. For some, this means continuing to hold hands, while for others, this may mean adopting another posture of prayer. [©]LPi

RCIA changes to OCIA

After the Second Vatican Council, the Church recognized the need to better serve those who were interested in becoming Catholic. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) was approved by the National Conference of Catholic Bishops in 1986, and by the Congregation for Divine Worship in 1987. In 2021, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops decided to change the name of the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) to Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA). The decision applies to the process and the ritual book of prayers. The name change reflects a closer translation of the process by which adults are initiated into the Catholic faith. Becoming a Catholic involves a period of intense discernment, and prayer, not simply going through the "rites" at fixed points of the year. In November 2022, the USCCB approved a revised edition of the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. Practically speaking, parishes will be adjusting to this new term, phasing out the term RCIA and switching over to the use of the term OCIA.





Bishop Joseph Perry was ordained a priest for service in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee on May 24, 1975, by Archbishop William Edward Cousins. Upon ordination, he was assigned as associate pastor of St. Nicholas Parish in Glendale, a post he held until he was assigned to the Tribunal Department of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee in December 1976, where he served as advocate in matrimonial cases and instructor of special cases. In August 1979 he was assigned to the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC, for graduate studies in canon law, receiving the licentiate degree in canon law in 1981. Returning to Milwaukee, he resumed service in the Tribunal for Milwaukee as judge in special cases and in the appeals section for the Dioceses of Green Bay, Superior, Madison, and LaCrosse. He was also director of the Conciliation/Arbitration services of the Archdiocese. He taught canon law as adjunct professor at Sacred Heart Seminary in Hales Corners and at Marquette University Law School.

He served as chaplain of the St. Thomas More Lawyers Society of Wisconsin, an association of lawyers and judges. In June 1995, after completing his term of service in the Tribunal, he was assigned pastor of All Saints Parish, Milwaukee, while serving as adjunct professor of canon law at St. Mary of the Lake Seminary in Mundelein, Illinois, where he teaches to this day. He continues to serve as judge ad causam on the Metropolitan Tribunal of Chicago.

On April 28, 1998, Father Joseph Perry was informed by the Vatican nuncio to the United States that he was appointed auxiliary bishop to Cardinal Francis George, OMI, Archbishop of Chicago. His consecration as a bishop took place on June 29,1998. Bishop Perry is spiritual advisor to the board for the World Apostolate of Fatima (WAF-USA) and currently chairs the USCCB Ad Hoc Committee Against Racism. Since 2010, Bishop Perry is also postulator for the cause of declared sainthood of Father Augustus Tolton (1854-1897) underway at the Vatican.
